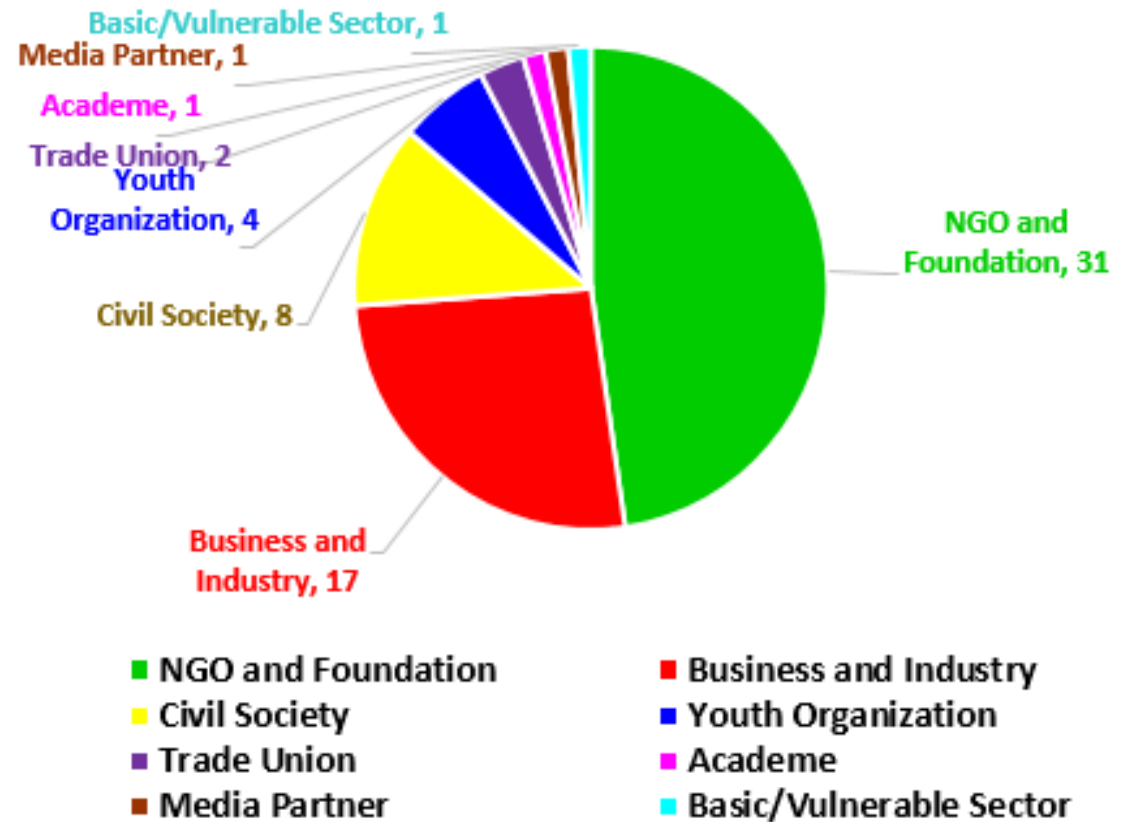

Areas of cooperation, focusing on lagging SDGs by sector, were presented to the Core Group in October 2023.

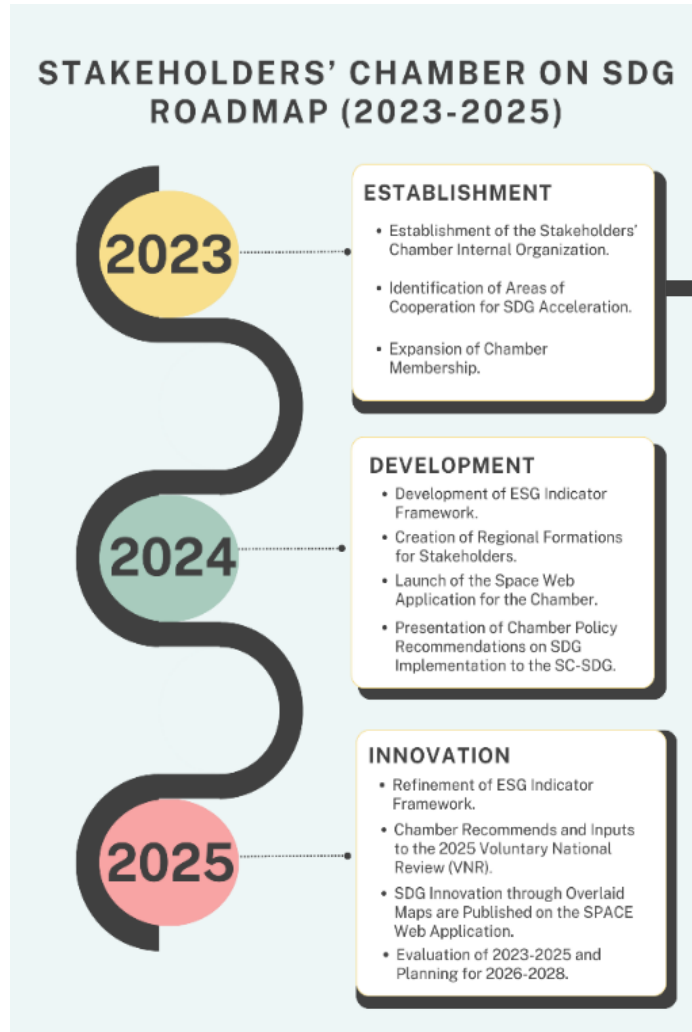
- Serves as guide to the WGs in formulating their respective work plans*

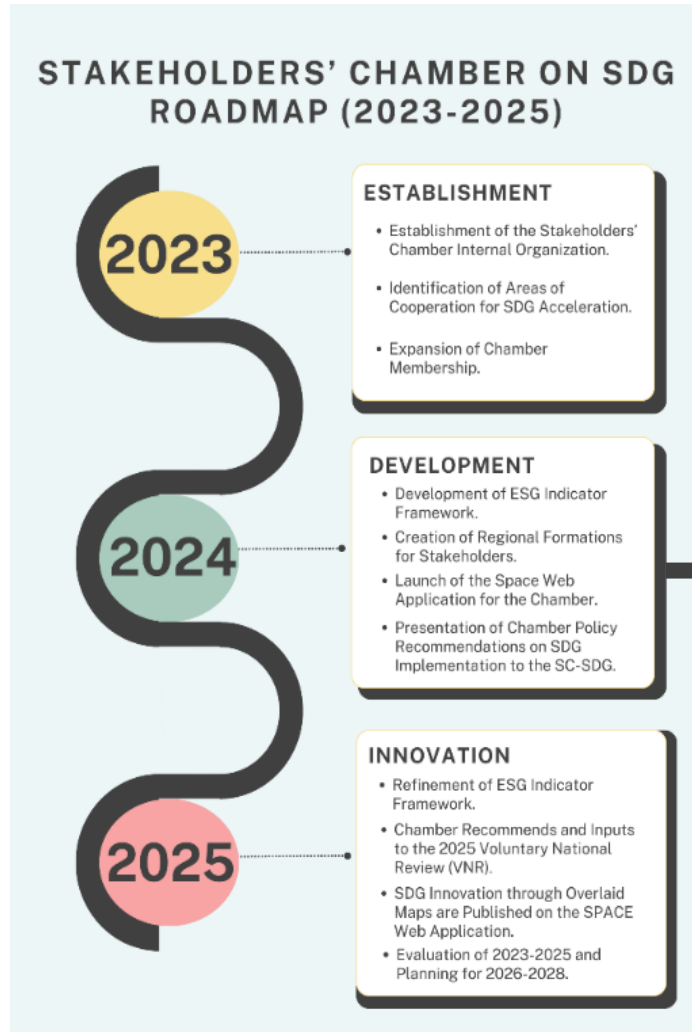

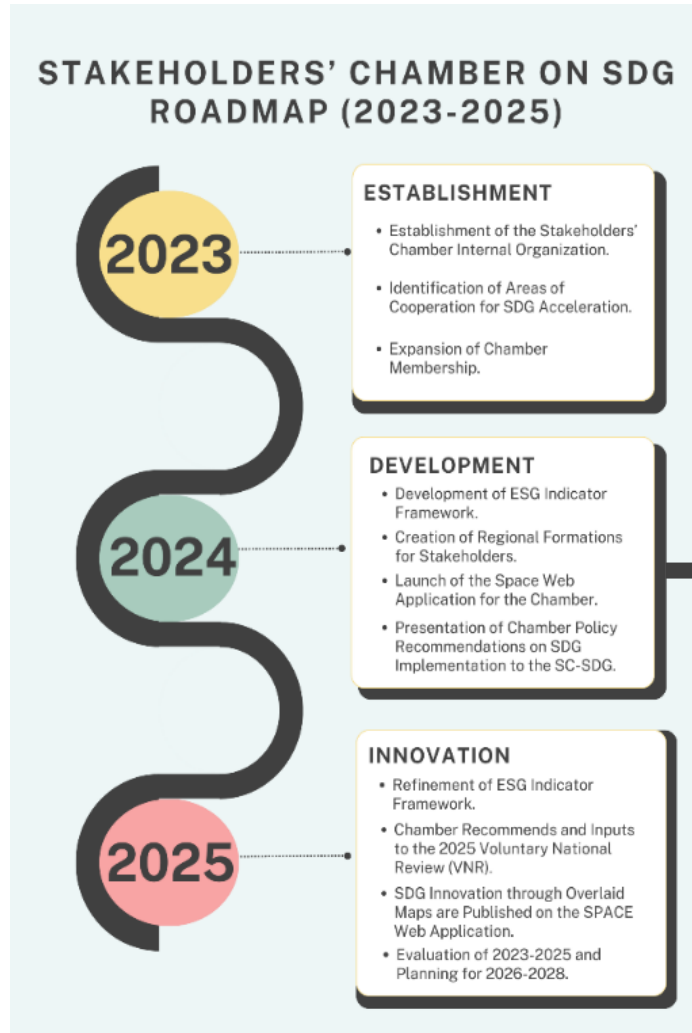

### Updates so far:

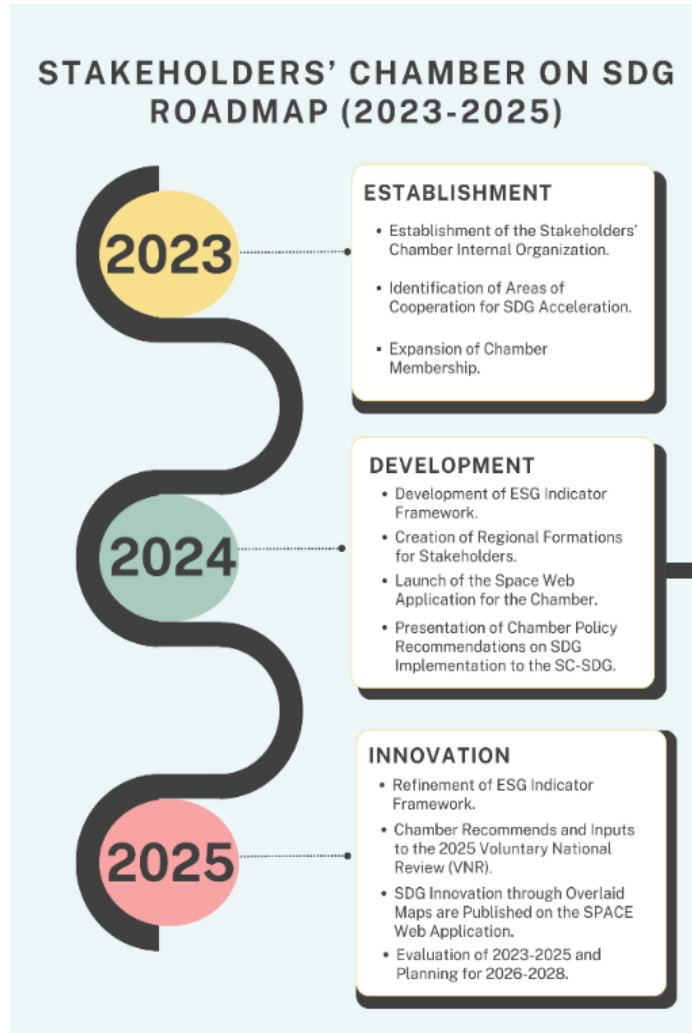
- Secretariat held a series of consultation meetings with the NEDA Regional Offices (NROs) as RDC Secretariats

**Launch of the Stakeholder Partnership Accelerator for Convergence and Engagement (SPACE) Web Application**

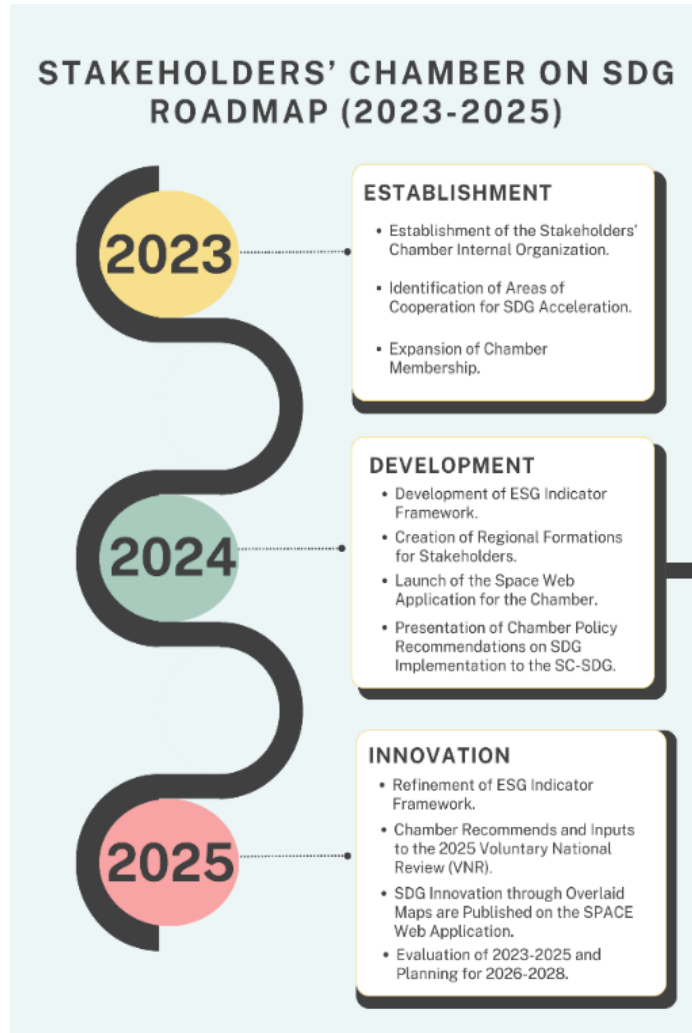
**Updates so far:**

**Role of the Chamber members:**

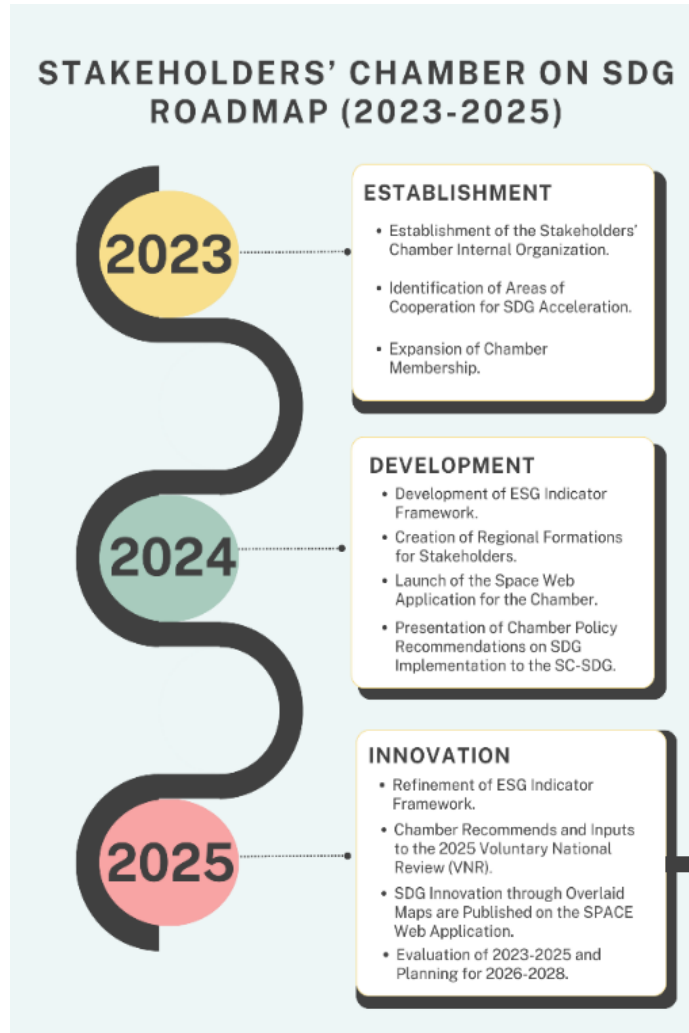
- Provide comments on the design of the Web App, following the demo.

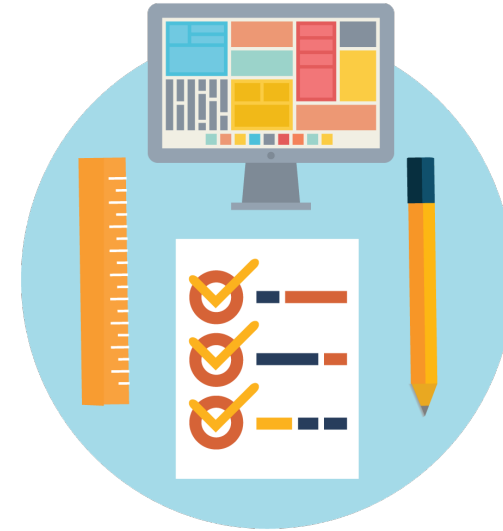
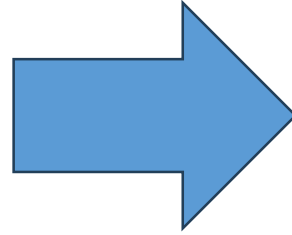

The 4Ps, which contribute to SDGs 1 (No Poverty), 2 (Zero Hunger), etc. are implemented with CSOs (e.g., in conduct of family development sessions).

# Assessment Tool / Checklist on the Philippine SDG Indicators

## What is it?

- Excel matrix developed by the M&M Working Group, in coordination with the SC-SDG Secretariat
- Aims to take stock of measures of performance, standards, and targets used by Chamber member organizations, and how they relate to the SDG indicators regularly monitored by the Philippines (Tier 1)
- Will serve as basis for the measures/indicators that the Chamber will adopt in its ESG/SDG Indicator and Strategy Framework
- Disseminated to members (through the WG Leads) on March 22, 2024. Accomplished forms were sent to WG Leads for processing on June 11, 2024. As of date, 41 out of 65 members have submitted.
